Spotlight Agency/ Emilie Glass-Riveros Senior research Specialist/ Center for Research on women

Emilie Glass from the University of Illinois Chicago presented her research project focused on substance use disorder among pregnant and parenting individuals—a population often overlooked in terms of funding and resources. The study, funded by the Pritzker Foundation, seeks to gather insights from both service providers and individuals with lived experience to better understand their needs and improve available support systems. Emilie explained that the research will involve private interviews conducted via Zoom or telephone, with participants receiving digital gift cards as compensation for their time. The data collected will be used to inform policy changes and strengthen community resources.

During the discussion, Emilie encouraged attendees to assist in distributing flyers for the initiative and offered to send them by email. A participant in the conference room expressed interest in sharing the flyers with home visitors and the Council. Emilie also clarified that participants for the study should be individuals who experienced substance use during pregnancy or while parenting. Before concluding her presentation, she invited any additional questions from attendees.

ROSC Council Holiday Schedule

Nicki stated that with the upcoming holidays approaching, the ROSC Council meetings are scheduled for November 25th and December 23rd. The Council agreed that both dates were acceptable. It was also decided that the December Council meeting will serve as a holiday party.

Subcommittee Updates

Nicki provided updates regarding the subcommittees. She stated that some adjustments will be made to improve effectiveness and align with current goals. The Second Chance Employment

Subcommittee will transition to in-person meetings to better complete action steps, and Nicki is currently waiting on a few members to confirm meeting dates and times.

The Resource Awareness Subcommittee will be discontinued, as it no longer aligns with the Council's current objectives. Additionally, Nikki announced plans to establish a new subcommittee focused on expanding harm reduction access and education within the community. She thanked everyone for their patience and understanding as these transitions take place.

Community Outreach / Trainings

Nicki and Jessica have begun assembling resource folders containing information about local services to distribute to area churches and businesses, with the goal of providing easily accessible support for individuals in need. Council members were encouraged to email any flyers or materials they would like included in these folders.

During the discussion, members shared ideas for future trainings to be offered in Edgar County, including substance use disorder awareness and mental health education. A suggestion was made to host these trainings in a community "lunch and learn" format to encourage participation. Additionally, the group noted the continued popularity and importance of active shooter training, particularly focusing on survivability techniques.

Printed copies of the **Community Resource Guide** were made available on the table for anyone interested in obtaining one. Appreciation was expressed to everyone who contributed to the development of the guide, including those who assisted with editing and compiling the resource list. Their efforts were acknowledged as an important part of ensuring accurate and comprehensive information for the community.
