C. Train the Trainer-Train the trainer groups are going well. They are growing more and more people are coming. We have a few new faces. Just for October, we have celebrated 4 sobriety birthdays. Every day sober is a miracle! ♥

1. **Vote on Artwork** -What does recovery look like to you? We had six people who are in recovery themselves draw what recovery looks like to them. Everyone's artwork was amazing. David Delmonico was the winner. We will be doing yard signs that will be spread throughout DeWitt County.
1. **Recovery Thanksgiving** - Recovery Thanksgiving is November 21st at DeWitt Manner at 5 pm. We are so grateful for all the donations and the volunteers who are offering their time to help make this a successful event for our community.
2. **Outside Naloxone Boxes-2** Outside Naloxone Boxes, we will be going around the neighborhood and reaching out to businesses about displaying our Naloxone Boxes. Some ideas that were mentioned are the Campgrounds, YMCA, and the Country Side Apartments
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3. **Recovery Walk**- Our guest speaker was our very own Jeanette Davis, our Logan/Mason ROSC. Her story was amazing; the community really took a liking to her and her story. We had around 40 people who came, even with the rain
4. **Community Survey** - Community Surveys we have 78 online surveys completed we have several paper surveys that need to be put in the SurveyMonkey. We will be going to Heritage and the health department to pick up more
5. **Guest Speaker- Kelsie Hall**- She shared her story about the darkness she went through because of her drug addiction to meth and other substances. She felt lost and unable to get away from it. Her family was hurting because of it. She was overdosing when her mom felt compelled to go home on her lunch break, which she never did, and found her daughter overdosing, and administered Narcan. After that day, she chose to get sober and fight for herself and her sobriety. She has a beautiful little girl and a great husband. She attends meetings and also volunteers in our community. At this monthly ROSC meeting, there were family members and friends who came to hear her speak. What a beautiful testimony.
