Reggie Handy

- Raised in a faith-based home at Shiloh Baptist Church, Waukegan, IL.
- Became involved in gangs and served time in incarceration.
- Upon release, entered Jack Clark Recovery Home, where he met Cliff Grisby and began his recovery journey.
- Earned restaurant work certificates and attended Rockway College, becoming a Recovery Home Operator.
- Later joined **Gateway Foundation**, working with court-mandated youth (ages 13–18) involved in gangs a true passion of his.
- Earned his Master's degree in 2013.
- His criminal record was later **expunged by Judge George Bridges**, who acknowledged Reggie's remarkable transformation.

Angela Woodard

• Originally from the Southside of Chicago; now resides in Zion, IL.

- Worked with the Wisconsin Department of Corrections at Halfway Homes.
- Experienced a personal tragedy in **April 2021**, losing her son to **fentanyl poisoning**.
- Shared the challenge of maintaining professionalism while navigating her own grief and that of others.
- Emphasized that grief should be integrated into recovery work.
- Reflected on her lifelong calling as a case manager and her gratitude for working in the recovery field.
- Author of A Blaze of Virtue, available on **Amazon**.

Elizabeth Thielen

- Grew up in a family impacted by alcoholism; later moved to Las Vegas, NV, with a stepfamily immersed in gambling.
- Former athlete—state and U.S. women's boxing champion, once on Sugar Ray Leonard's ticket, before an injury ended her career.
- After multiple personal losses, turned to gambling for solace and eventually developed a gambling addiction.
- Now serves as a Problem and Compulsive Gambling Counselor with NICASA Behavioral Health Services.
- Reflected on overcoming fears of being recognized and continuing her personal growth.
- Celebrates over 10 years of recovery from gambling.
- Expressed gratitude to **NIRCO** for creating safe spaces for continued healing.
