The Illinois ROSC Council (Recovery-Oriented Systems of Care Council) is a statewide collaborative network dedicated to promoting and strengthening recovery support systems for individuals and families affected by substance use and mental health challenges. Summary



The Dekalb Mental Health Board did a deeper study to access Mental Health/Substance Use Disorder in their survey "Collaboration for Equity and Belonging in Behavioral Healthcare Committee (2023). They took multiple factors into consideration such as race, age, gender, ethnicity etc. According to the respondents and their results, they would like to see more support or peer groups, an inpatient/outpatient treatment center and partial hospitalization programs. This is consistent with the Community Needs Assessment that we did, as far as the need for in-patient treatment. We did not ask any questions about peer led groups or partial hospitalization programs; however, this gives us more information to utilize for our next assessment for the needs of the community. In this survey many respondents had also expressed having negative experiences seeking help in the past and the feeling that the language barrier matters when referring to mental health issues.
