Meeting Summary

1. Laundry Day Event Planning: Laundry event scheduled for Wednesday before Christmas is cancelled due to holiday; Laundry Day concerns volunteers and cost; Net Community pledged \$30 to Staunton Laundry Days every month; consortium decision to proceed and recruit more volunteers.

2. Laundry Day Sustainability: Fundraising limitations for MCPHD; ROSC members may fundraise. consider bi-weekly schedule; community laundry expansion to Carlinville discussed.

3. Community Laundry Days Program: Continue weekly in Gillespie, Litchfield, Mount Olive, Staunton; 3 volunteers per site; Red Cross partnership opportunities; ongoing promotion.

4. Community Outreach & Resource Coordination: Red Cross home visits; media outreach; food assistance needs; coat/blanket drive; new member introductions.

Program & Initiative Updates

5. Madison County Opioid Response Grant: Jessica Banner shared outreach updates; 600+ individuals engaged; emphasis on lived experience and collaboration.

6. Homelessness Initiatives: CRT evolution; medical respite pilot program; new case manager appointed.
7. Medical Respite Program Expansion: Transition to scattered-hotel model; potential CRT expansion: November statistics reviewed.
8. Program Continuation & Expansion: Program continuation pending funding; Carlinville expansion. strategic priorities include equity, stigma reduction, harm reduction, potential town hall.
9. Carlinville Hospital MAR Program Launch: Launch in December; emergency overdose care. survey results show stigma reduction; 2026 plans include CRT and OFR; emphasis on community education.
