Discussion: Planning resource bundles for individuals exiting incarceration

- What should be included?
 - Marie Riley- Narcan and test strips for fentanyl, xylazine
 - Jeanette Davis- testing strips for fentanyl, xylazine
 - Individuals in similar circumstances in Logan County have responded positively to recovery resources (meetings, housing)
 - MAR information - vivitrol / buprenorphine
 - Lt. Conard- vivitrol is impractical due to shortened length of stays in jail (SAFE-T act). The jail has moved more towards bup. / Methadone
 - Family Guidance Centers (FGC) currently provides for both
 - Open to new avenues for vivitrol
 - SIU START Clinic was suggested, and contact info will be provided via email
 - Lt. Conard- the jail can't provide education on testing kits, but ROSC can include them in resource bundles
 - ROSC brochures / contact info

- Employment info
 - Express Employment- ROSC will reach out to get additional information / brochures
 - Illinois Work Net- ROSC will reach out to IDES to get additional information / brochures
- Recovery navigator info (Recovery Corps)- helps with education, community, and employment
- Lt. Conard- biggest needs seen are transportation and food assistance
 - Transportation vouchers- possibly given out separately (case by case)
 - Food resources- possibly given out separately (case by case)
 - Hygiene items- more of a specific need
- Eligibility:
 - Lt. Conard- option to give resource guides on demand
 - Kiosk that processes request (screener model)- used to help identify individuals that need resources
 - MH / SUD-involved individuals will get resource bundles automatically as part of re-entry plan
 - High turnover makes giving every returning individual a bundle difficult due (due to high demand)
- Transportation:
 - Bus tokens: Springfield Mass Transit District (SMTD)
 - Audie Prange- will get SMTD contact info to Whitney / Austin
- Tracking bundles:
 - A monthly report could be compiled via record from kiosk
 - Can be used to identify trends and patterns
 - Set amount for SUD, set amount for MH, ROSC would be contacted for specific bundles (transportation, food, housing, hygiene, etc.)
- Assembly- after holidays
 - Jeanette Davis, Marie Riley volunteered to help
- Additional needs:
 - 3x AA meetings in the jails per week, trying to get 1x NA meeting per week
 - Scheduling training sessions becomes an issue, but they are willing to work with individuals to help get them trained / approved to facilitate meetings

Next Steps:

- ROSC will follow up with emails regarding events (Matt Lantgen, Sam Brown), resource bundles (Lt. Conard, Audie Prange, Jeanette Davis, Marie Riley)
- Promotion of ROSC x Gateway Foundation's upcoming trivia night event



Resource Bundles for Individuals Exiting Incarceration

- What should go in it?
 - Insight from individuals with lived experience?
- Who's going to take care of what?
- Eligibility
 - Expressed need?
 - Screener / questionnaire to determine if individuals have needs? (housing instability, food insecurity, transportation needs, hygiene needs, MH / SUD treatment or recovery needs)
- Distribution
 - Process (to make easy for jail staff- reduce additional work, prevent individuals from falling through the cracks)
- How to track progress / distribution?
