

Associate of Arts to Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art – Film and Photography

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between the City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) and Governors State University (GovState) for the Art degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from one of the CCC and a Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) degree in Art – Film and Photography from GovState. All students are admitted conditionally. The art faculty will monitor and evaluate student progress continuously. All art students will have a mandatory portfolio evaluation after 1 year of enrollment.
