Old Business:

- **What is ROSC?**
 - ROSC is a coordinated network of community-based services and supports that is person-centered and builds on the strengths and resilience of individuals, families, and communities to experience recovery and improved health, wellness, and quality of life for those with or at risk of substance use and/or mental health challenges. The central focus of a ROSC is to create an infrastructure, or “systems of care”, with the resources to effectively address the full range of substance use and/or mental health challenges within communities.
- **Logan/Mason ROSC Mission Statement**
 - Improving access to health, wellness, and holistic recovery options for people who are at risk of, or suffering from, substance use disorders while educating and connecting Logan and Mason counties to reduce stigma and improve recovery outcomes.
- **Hidden Risks Human Trafficking Event:**
 - This event was held in Bloomington-Normal at the Illinois State University Alumni Center in coordination with the McLean County ROSC and Allies Against Trafficking. There ended up being a total of **54 attendees** at the event. We are looking to continue having partnered events with Allies Against Trafficking in the future.
- **Valentine’s Day Party:**
 - The Logan Mason ROSC and its Recovery in Action committee hosted a Valentine’s Day Party at Hope on Fifth. The event had a great turnout with **24 people in attendance**.
- **BRIDGE Launch:**
 - The BRIDGE initiative has officially launched. The launch meeting had **42 people in attendance**, many of which were law enforcement officers in the counties served under the BRIDGE initiative. The referral process is already going great in Lincoln/Logan County.

Community Resource List Updates:

- Molly noted that the counseling office at Jeff Street Church needs to be added to the resource list. Ron suggested that Christian and Montgomery County need to have a similar resource list themselves.



Harm Reduction Location Planning:

- The Logan Mason ROSC is looking to have a planning committee to help with identifying and reaching out to potential locations for harm reduction locations in Logan and Mason County. Kara, Ron, and Lisa stated they would be a part of the committee.

Reframing Recovery Boxes:

- These boxes will be distributed throughout the community in Logan and Mason County. The boxes will be used to help businesses with the destigmatization of recovery by providing resources for how to reframe recovery and harm reduction materials such as naloxone and test strips. The boxes will also contain promotional materials such as window clings, wristbands, lanyards and pens. The boxes will also contain information concerning Medication Assisted Recovery (MAR) and Reframing Recovery Journals.
