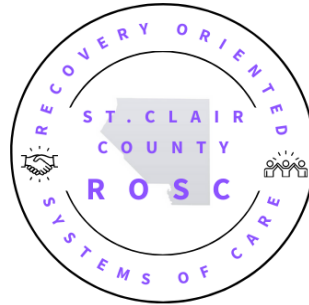

Agenda Items/Next Steps:

- 1. *Sign-in/Welcome:*** Angella welcomed/introduced Council/Community friends. Each partner introduced themselves, agency represented and (1) update to share. Thanked current council members and community partners for supporting the ROSC council; encouraged members to reference ROSC overview (*via table/previous attachment/email*) to provide details for program goals and Q3 summary. Encouraged Council to visit the GSU website to review Strategic Plan and previous quarterly summaries; [Recovery Coaching Network at GSU](#).
- 2. *ROSC updates, i.e.,*** The ROSC provided a program “snapshot” of Q3 data/updates re: ROSC logo and Outreach supplies/updates. Each member was provided with a copy of the Q3 summary/highlights (see below) for reference and to use to describe this support within the community. We encouraged the Council to continue communicating with Faith-Based and Civic sectors re: ROSC efforts and contact us for follow-up.

Community Goal 1 Highlights:

- Informational packets/Overview available/shard with many!
- 19 NEW community partners involved!
- Peer Advisory (People with Lived Experiences) and ACTION Teams- 3 mtgs!
- Attended/Co-facilitated/Organized multiple community events/activities to provide ROSC/community resources for continued awareness.
- Increased Youth Prevention/Faith & Recovery supports in various settings.

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ACTION steps:

- To increase PLE participation for Peer Advisory, acquire Faith-based sector for Council by July 2026.
- Plan/schedule Summer “Kick-Off” Community event-TBD.
- Finalize Resource Guide, i.e., Bond. Clinton, Madison and SCC- TBD.

Community Goal 2 Highlights:

- Continued collaboration with current MAR providers for training/supports/updates re: harm reduction.
- (3) Community agencies agreed to receive Naloxone training- referred to OEND team for assistance.
- Attended (4) community forums to speak with Youth/Community stakeholders re: addiction, recovery and shared evidence-based information.
- Ongoing collaboration with public/county officials to support ROSC/community efforts.

ACTION steps:

- To collaborate with (2) communities to reduce barriers/perceptions/lack of knowledge re: harm reduction supports/Naloxone training, by Aug 2026.
- To identify, organize and schedule educational events re: Mental Health/First Aid/Youth prevention/NIMB perception in communities identified (see survey data to select areas, based on zip codes) by Aug 2026.

- 3. People with Lived Experiences; Speakers:** Due to unforeseen circumstances, the speakers were unable to attend today’s meeting.
- 4. We need YOUR help! Let’s talk...Safety!** Due to limited meeting time, the ROSC and council members briefly discussed ways to assist rural areas; i.e., Fairmont City, Lenzburg, Millstadt, Marissa and Belleville areas, to ensure reliable safety measures for spring/summer months with Hispanic/Youth/Senior/Homeless populations. Various agencies recommended speaking with Bridges of Hope, IHELP STL, Go! International, Senior services, local shelters and International Institute for resources/assistance. We will reconvene at next month’s meeting for updates re: IL State Police initiative, BTAM, Behavioral Threatening Assessment Mitigation, project and how we can increase community awareness of this resource.
- 5. Closing remarks/thank you:**

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Reminded council to find time to connect and follow up with community friends when time permits. Requested council to continue reporting on their meeting takeaways to “share out” at the beginning of each meeting.

Due to end time, we thanked the virtual members for attending and assured them that we would follow-up with meeting minutes, but they were free to log off if needed; In-person council members were encouraged to network, share resources and exchange contact information with new partners for continued collaboration, next steps, and increase community awareness.
