Agenda Item: Introductions of attendees & ice breaker

Meeting Summary: This was the ROSC Council's final meeting for FY26, where Kristina led a summary of the year's accomplishments and upcoming plans. The group discussed recent activities including a communication campaign press release on connection and community, upcoming events like a laundry day in Greenup and candlelight vigil in August, and plans for Recovery Month activities including purple-themed events and personal recovery stories. The ROSC Council reviewed their quarterly progress on priorities including Narcan distribution, recovery housing initiatives, and diversion program workflows, noting particular success with Narcan training and community partnerships. They addressed scheduling challenges for future meetings to increase attendance and discussed ongoing efforts to establish a parent night at Cumberland Schools featuring a Hidden in Plain Sight presentation.

Expanding Harm Reduction Access and Awareness: We had a goal of adding 6 new DOPP Sites during this last fiscal year and we added 5.

Diversion Program: Kristina and Kyle had a meeting with the State's Attorney, Probation and the Judge to discuss how the program is going and ways to expand the program. Kyle created a workflow that will be used. In addition, Kyle will be trained to do assessments for his role as part-time Recovery Navigator outside of ROSC Council work.

Laundry Days: Our next Laundry Day will be held on June 24th from 1-5 PM at E-Z Laundry in Greenup. The program has grown significantly in popularity, and the owners of the laundromat sponsored this Laundry Day with a \$200 donation, but we are looking for future sponsorships.

Past Events: The Strikes for Strength Bowling event was a great success with a lot of families in attendance. The last Narcan Training of this fiscal year had 24 Firefighters in attendance.

Upcoming Events: The Candlelight Vigil will be held on August 28th at 7:30 PM at the gazebo on the square in Toledo. We are looking for a speaker for this event.

Communication Campaign: We are highlighting "Connection & Community Support Recovery" during the month of June. This campaign focus emphasizes the important role

social connection, healthy relationships, and community support play in mental wellness and recovery. The campaign is designed to raise awareness about the impact connection and support can have on individuals experiencing substance use and mental health challenges. Community members are encouraged to engage in compassionate conversations, support local recovery initiatives, and help create welcoming spaces where individuals feel safe seeking help and support.

Quarterly Report: Kristina went over the progress that has been made towards the three priorities in the last three months including new DOPP site partners and Narcan trainings, the expansion of the Diversion Program, and strengthening partnerships by securing at least three community supporters.

Membership Protocols: Kristina and Kyle explained what is included in the membership protocols and went over the council's mission and vision statements.

. Reminders/Tasks:

- Kristina will contact Coffee and Creams and Kirby (and/or other local businesses) to coordinate purple-themed drinks, desserts, or other items for Recovery Month in September.
- Kristina & Kyle reach out to individuals for personal recovery stories/testimonies to share during Recovery Month; follow up with group members for submissions.
- Kristina will send out emails to gauge group members' availability for future meeting times. The main goal is to improve attendance, and this is also prompted by a scheduling conflict with the Edgar County ROSC Council meeting.
- Kristina will contact the appropriate person at the Neoga truck stop to set up a new DOPP (Narcan) display partner.
- Kyle will reach out to the Cumberland High School health teacher to explore opportunities to participate in or host a "Hidden in Plain Sight" parent night or similar event at the school. The new superintendent was initially supportive, but the project had fallen through the cracks, so this follow-up is intended to coordinate with existing school events and get it back on track.
- Kyle will continue work on writing the workflow for the diversion program with the judicial system.
- Kyle will begin preparations for assessments in jails as part of the diversion program and justice-involved goals.
- Madison will contact Olivia to obtain "Hidden in Plain Sight" presentation materials and ideas for the potential parent night at Cumberland Schools.
- Sara will attend scheduled meeting with Liesl and the new superintendent to discuss the "Hidden in Plain Sight" event at Cumberland Schools for the next school year. The superintendent has not yet confirmed approval for the event; Sara will work to finalize details and confirm.
- All members: if able, suggest or recommend potential speakers (overdose survivors or those who have lost loved ones) for the August 28th candlelight vigil.
- All members: Inform anyone who may benefit about the upcoming Laundry Day event in Greenup and encourage potential sponsors for future events.
