We use these words in the survey and recognize the they may not be widely known. The definitions are listed below for those that may need them.

- **Drug Overdose Prevention Program (DOPP) Site:** A place in the community, like a library or business, with a public Naloxone (Narcan) display. These sites give out free Narcan, a medicine that saves lives by reversing drug overdoses. Anyone can take Narcan here at any time. You do not have to answer questions or give your name.
- **Harm Reduction:** Practical ways to lower the dangers of drug use. This includes preventing overdoses and stopping the spread of diseases. It also makes it easier for people to get healthcare.
- **Recovery:** A process of change where people improve their health, take control of their lives, and reach their goals.
- **Recovery Court:** A special court program for people who struggle with drug or alcohol use. It is an alternative to jail. Instead of going to prison, participants get treatment, counseling, and support from a case manager. This court helps keep communities safe by helping people get treatment and support for recovery.
- **Recovery or Transitional Housing:** A safe, drug-free, and alcohol-free place to live for people in recovery from drug or alcohol use. Residents support each other and follow house rules. They also get help finding jobs or moving into their own homes later. It is a bridge between rehab and living on your own.
- **Substance Use Disorder:** A medical condition related to drug or alcohol use. It is a medical condition where a person cannot stop using a substance, even when it harms them.
