Key Approvals

- Without Objection, the meeting minutes from August were approved.

Announcements

- Discussion was held regarding in-house changes. Staff will continue to communicate and work together throughout the transition.
- Discussed the upcoming **Chalk the Walk** event members were encouraged to participate and help support the event.
- The council discussed the upcoming **Recovery Bonfire** event and shared that the Recovery Council has partnered with Bright Futures to host the event. Members were encouraged to participate and help make the event a positive opportunity for connection, fellowship, and recovery support.
- Went over the annual survey process and the need to have surveys completed again this year. Members were encouraged to help distribute the surveys and encourage community members and partners to participate.

Guest Speakers- Centerstone

Speaker- Sarah Hampton with Centerstone

1. Sarah Hampton from Centerstone spoke with the council about the services and resources available through Centerstone. She discussed their Detox Program, which provides a 3–7 day detoxification program for individuals needing support during the early stages of recovery.

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2. Sarah also discussed Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) services, which combine medications with counseling and behavioral health support to help individuals address substance use and work toward recovery.
3. Sarah highlighted Family Services, which include resources such as parenting classes designed to provide parents and caregivers with additional support, education, and tools to strengthen their families.
4. She also shared that Centerstone works with the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) to provide support and services to families involved with the agency.
5. Sarah shared that Centerstone has a psychiatric provider available and that their services can be accessed through telehealth, providing individuals with a convenient option for receiving care remotely.

Updates

- ❖ Memorial Behavioral Health shared that they now offer therapy services in Greene County, providing additional access to behavioral health support for individuals in the community.
- ❖ Gateway shared that they have rebranded their organization under the name Alphasus. The name and branding have changed, but their services and programs remain the same.
- ❖ Probation shared that they have a new director and are currently hiring an additional probation officer. Once the position is filled, there will be three probation officers serving Greene and Scott Counties.
- ❖ TASC shared that Rock for Recovery will be taking place this weekend, featuring Amare. Members were encouraged to attend and support the recovery-focused event.

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- ❖ Illinois Valley shared that their email account was compromised and they are currently working to resolve the issue. They are hopeful that access will be restored soon. They also provided an overview of the services and resources they have available to support individuals and families in the community.
