The purpose of this survey is to measure public opinion on issues related to substance use, mental health and/or recovery. Definitions

Criminal Justice System: The police, courts, jails, prisons, probation, and other services that deal with laws and crime.

Drug Court: A court program that combines supervision, substance use treatment, and recovery support to help eligible people address substance use and avoid future legal problems.

DOPP site- (Drug Overdose Prevention Program site): A place in the community, like a library or business, with a public Narcan (Naloxone) display. These sites give out free Narcan, a medicine that saves lives by reversing opioid overdoses. Anyone can take Narcan here at any time. You do not have to answer questions or give your name.

Harm Reduction: Services and support that help keep people safer and reduce the harmful effects of drug use.

MAR (Medication-Assisted Recovery): The use of medications, along with support or counseling, to help treat substance use disorders.

Naloxone (Narcan): a medicine that can quickly reverse an opioid overdose and help save a person's life.

Recovery: A process of making positive changes to improve health and well-being after problems with substance use or mental health.

Substance Use Disorder (SUD): A health condition where a person's use of alcohol or drugs causes problems in their life and is hard to stop or control.
