The August meeting for the Peoria County ROSC was a huge success! We had 31 people in attendance. This included 14 people with lived experience. Chance Uhland of Celebrate Recovery and the Galesburg Rescue Mission was our monthly presenter. Chance detailed his recovery journey and his professional work journey, which included being a ROSC Coordinator, Peer Support and Case Management at the Rescue Mission, and being a Celebrate Recovery Regional representative. Chance also highlighted the work he has done over the past 2 months being the Director of the Galesburg Rescue Mission. Chance also detailed how the mission takes people from any type of background and demographic. The mission is also an approved IDOC parole sight. They also are MAR/MAT friendly and promote harm reduction efforts. They also house single mothers and their children. PCR did a 15-minute rap session and voted on the final draft of our survey. Many council members are excited about the upcoming survey and hopes are high to generate many responses from many demographics! The PCR Coordinator has met with council members, colleagues, and superiors to discuss the strategic plan and the trajectory of the Peoria County ROSC. There is great momentum at this present time. Many future collaborations and events are in the planning process.

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
