RED SUMMER paints a vivid picture of a crucial moment in Chicago history. Brutally honest, while hauntingly provocative and personal, RED SUMMER presents an intimate portrait that eerily mirrors our present time. Crafted by MPAACT co-founders Shepsu Aakhu and Shawn Wallace, along with Andrew White, a co-founder of Lookingglass Theatre Company, this large-scale world premiere will showcase a cast of 20 of Chicago's finest actors, singers, and musicians.



Set during the Chicago race riots of 1919, *RED SUMMER* centers on two soldiers—one black, one white—who return from the battlefields of Europe only to find themselves caught in the violence of a city that is struggling to accommodate the Great Migration, a global pandemic, the return of war veterans, a downturn in the economy, and long-standing ethnic tensions. Having fought on the same side in "The Great War," and now pitted against each other as their friends, family, and neighbors wage block-by-block warfare, and the city's ethnic enclaves rage and burn.







Battle of the Baritones



Mariachi Herencia de México

Saturday, October 1 at 7:30 p.m.

The historic tradition of mariachi music has roots in cities like Guadalajara and Mexico City, places where the festive folk style lived its past glory days in the mid-1900s. Today, the future of the evolving genre may rest in the hands of a dynamic ensemble from the capital of the American Midwest: Chicago's Mariachi Herencia de México.

The Latin GRAMMY-nominated group of young Mexican-American musicians have released four highly acclaimed studio albums with chart-topping debuts on both the Billboard and the iTunes Latin Albums charts, defying a music industry trend and pointing to a revival in recorded mariachi music.

Mariachi expert and historian Jonathan Clark describes their recent album *Esencia, Vol 2* as "A masterpiece. This is mariachi music at its most sophisticated and most modernistic. It's almost the antithesis of folklore, almost futuristic. Maybe 20 or 30 years from now, all groups will sound like this. I don't know. But it is state-of-the-art."

Mariachi Herencia de México has toured throughout the U.S., Mexico and Canada performing in some of the most prestigious performing arts centers across the continent, including Washington D.C.'s The Kennedy Center and Guadalajara's Teatro Degollado. The group has performed alongside major artists like Lila Downs, Aida Cuevas, Los Lobos, Pedro Fernández, as well as some of the most respected mariachi groups from both sides of the border, including Mariachi Vargas de Tecatitlán, Los Camperos, Sol de Mexico, Cobre, and the all-female group Reyna de Los Angeles, demonstrating that this group of young musicians have the talent, training and bravado to hold their own with the best in the world.






the spirit and energy of the country's finest early-career dance talent with the passion and creative vision of today's most outstanding emerging choreographers.



The Nutcracker



CLOUD 9

Cloud 9 is a satirical commentary of the British Empire and its rigid perspectives on gender roles and sexuality. The first act follows Clive, a colonial administrator, and his family as they try to contain the British colonies in Africa during the Victorian era. The second act follows the surviving characters in London, 1980. Between the acts, the characters have only aged 25 years and have been freed from their sexual repression, as well as from the Empire. In Cloud 9, adults play children; men and women play opposite genders; and a white man plays a black man. With its inventive casting and Churchill's biting analysis of social structures, Cloud 9 is an intelligent and comedic show that will challenge yesterday and today's society.






