"CREATIVE RESEARCH METHODS AT GOVSTATE: POSSIBILITIES FOR CROSS-POLLINATION AND COLLABORATION"

Research and Scholarship undertakings are important to higher education institutions. They play a vital role in creating future generations of critical thinkers and engaged citizens. In celebration of the collaboration and creativity that makes GovState a higher education institution of continuous learning, this keynote panel presentation showcases some of the diverse techniques of inquiry utilized by GSU faculty in their research and scholarship activities.

In this session we have four presentations by faculty from different colleges at GSU. The Q&A discussion that will follow individual presentations will cover strengths and challenges of each technique and consider its potential for collaborative research on problems requiring cross disciplinary solutions.

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Katherine Carl, Ph.D. I Experimental Research Methods



Assistant Professor of Business Analytics and Management Information Systems in Business Analytics in the College of Business, Dr. Carl will present how she has used experimental research related to video games, online learning, and self-efficacy. Experimental research seeks to determine if a specific treatment influences an outcome. This impact is assessed by providing a specific treatment to one group and withholding it from one or more other groups and then determining how each group scored on an outcome.

Frank Czuba, DrOT, OTR/L | Action Research & Photovoice Methods



Assistant Professor of Occupational Therapy, College of Health and Human Services, Dr. Czuba will present on the use of Action Research & Photovoice. One of the foremost advantages of action research is the immediacy of its applications and its ability to catalyze improvements in an organization or community. Photovoice is an established method developed initially by health promotion researchers. In this method participants take photographs and then reflect upon and explore the reasons, emotions and experiences that have guided their chosen images.

Christopher A. Dignam, Ed.D. | Portraiture Research Methods



Assistant Professor of Interdisciplinary Leadership, College of Education, Dr. Dignam will present on Portraiture Research Methods. Portraiture is a research technique that brings together art, narratives, case study, phenomenology and ethnography by creating individual vignettes that allow for a focus on stories of success and positivity in times of difficulty.

Megan VanGorder, Ph.D.



Assistant Professor of History and Coordinator of Secondary Social Studies Education, College of Arts and Sciences, Dr. VanGorder will present on Historical & Archival Methods. Archival research is a type of research which involves seeking out and extracting evidence from archival records, where archives refer to materials that are unique, specialized or rare objects, few of which are believed to exist.
