Board Appointments

In 2015, Cornelius was appointed by the Mayor Rahm Emanuel's Office as a Commissioner on the Community Development Commission (CDC). The Community Development Commission (CDC) was established by the Chicago City Council in 1992 to assume the duties of the former Commercial District Development Commission and the Department of Urban Renewal. The CDC reviews and recommends action on the provision of Tax Increment Financing (TIF) to assist private redevelopment projects; the designation of new TIF districts and Redevelopment Areas; the sale of City-owned property located in TIF districts and Redevelopment Areas; and the appointment of members to Community Conservation Councils. The CDC is comprised of 15 members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

In 2014, Cornelius was appointed by the Mayor Rahm Emanuel's Office to sit on the Chicago Community Land Trust Board of Directors. The Land Trust was founded in 2006 to address the increasingly limited supply of funding for affordable housing. The goal of the CCLT is to preserve the long-term affordability of homes created through City programs and maintain a permanent pool of homeownership opportunities for working families. The

CCLT is a non-profit corporation, with a board of directors that is appointed by the Mayor with Chicago City Council consent.

In 2009, Cornelius was appointed as Chairman of the Board of Directors for Introspect Youth Services Alumni Association. Introspect is a non-profit organization that assist inner-city youth from underserved communities with college preparation and readiness.

Civic Responsibility

U.S. Senate Round Table Panel – Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions - Cornelius participated in a round table entitled "Strengthening Federal Access Programs to meet 21st Century Needs – A look at Trio and Gear up Programs". The round table was moderated by Committee Chairman Senator Harkin (D-Iowa) and included both Republican and Democratic U.S. Senators.
