Students will conduct and report on their in-depth cancer research project; hear from cancer researchers; learn about healthcare disparities and ways to address them; and engage in workshops to build research and professional skills.

<u>Full-time undergraduates</u> entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year at University of Illinois Chicago, Governor State University, or Malcolm X College are eligible to apply.

This is a 10-week program, taking place <u>June 5 - August 11</u>, 2023, on the University of Illinois Chicago campus. Participating students can expect to commit up to 40 hours per week, and will receive a <u>\$5,000</u> stipend. Applications will be open through <u>February 13th</u>, with priority until <u>January 31st</u>, 2023.
