What is Community Health?

Community health focuses on public health practice, aspects of interaction of individuals, families and community structures. The behavioral sciences form the theoretical basis for community interventions to enhance health and well-being.

What do Community/Public Health Educators Do?

Develop, plan, implement, and evaluate health programs and services.

What kind of job can I get with a Community Health Degree?

Community/Public Health Educators work in all geographic settings worldwide, although their roles vary depending on the location.

Job Outlook

Employment of health educators and community health workers is projected to grow 21 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations.
