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Initial Licensure

Candidates who have a bachelor's degree from an accredited university and are seeking a master's degree and an initial Illinois Professional Educator License in Early Childhood Education (Birth to Grade 2).

Earning a degree in Early Childhood Education (ECE) prepares you for working with children from birth through second grade. At GovState, you will gain the professional knowledge and competencies needed to become a highly effective educator so you can provide your students with nurturing and safe learning environments and help make a positive difference in the lives of young children and their families. Through your studies, you will learn the educational, developmental, social, and physical needs of young children and work alongside mentor teachers who model best practices in early childhood.

Program Requirements

After meeting the university admission requirements, students must meet the following additional requirements to be admitted to and continue in the Early Childhood Education program:

- must have a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.75 or higher on a 4.0 scale in all undergraduate work from an accredited institution (GPA of 2.5 to 2.74 may be conditionally admitted)
- must earn a grade of "B-" or better in all teacher education coursework at GSU
