To aid in the affordability, DDP students can compete for scholarships that cover their *full* tuition and fees if they choose to attend GSU! These are only available to DDP students, so there is less competition than most other scholarships. The scholarship application deadline for those transferring in fall 2019 is February 22, 2019. Male Success Initiative (MSI)

Welcome back to the Spring 2019 semester! For MSI members at the community college, we would like to inform you about a new scholarship program at GSU. <u>AIM High</u> is an automatically awarded, merit based scholarship for both transfer and freshman students. This program also offers additional funding for students involved in male minority mentoring programs - such as MSI! Here are some key points about AIM High:

- Award amounts are based on final transfer GPA, with the opportunity to earn up to \$8,000 over 2 academic years!
- Any amount awarded may be applied to tuition and fees in addition to other scholarships you receive!
- Participation in MSI qualifies you for an additional \$1,000 per academic year.

If you will be transferring Fall of 2019 or later, you are eligible for this scholarship! To be considered for the additional funding, please include a personal statement with your application, and contact your college's program coordinator for a verification letter. 
DDP's Shining Star

Important Updates

Fall 2019 DDP Scholarship Applications due Friday, February 22nd- LAST CHANCE FOR APPLICATION

DDP students, would you like to attend GSU for FREE? If you are transferring to GSU in fall 2019, make sure to apply for the <u>GSU Promise</u> <u>Scholarship</u>, <u>DDP Honors Scholarship</u>, and/or the <u>DDP Chicago STAR Scholars Scholarships</u>. These scholarships are only available to DDP students. Students who qualify for both are encouraged to apply for both, although students may only be awarded one out of those eligible.

- The GSU Promise Scholarship is a competitive scholarship for DDP students who receive the Federal Pell Grant and have at least a 2.75 GPA. It covers full tuition and fees and a book stipend for up to four semesters at GSU (excluding summers). Illinois undocumented students are also encouraged to apply for the GSU Promise Scholarship for the chance to earn a \$600 book stipend for up to four semesters at GSU!
- The DDP Honors Scholarship is a competitive scholarship for DDP students who are current members of their community college Honors Program or chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society and have at least a 3.5 GPA. It covers full tuition and fees at GSU for up to four semesters (excluding summers).
- DDP students at the City Colleges of Chicago may also be eligible for the DDP Chicago STAR Scholars Scholarship. It is open to DDP students who are enrolled in the Chicago STAR Scholars program, are active members of CCC's Honors Program or chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honors Society, and have a 3.25 GPA or above. There are two (2) scholarship categories; see the DDP Chicago STAR Scholar app for more details!

Applications, recommendation forms, and FAQs can be found on the GSU Scholarship site. Application materials are due on Friday, Feb 22, 2019!



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

While DDP students have the opportunity to participate in monthly community service events, one of our newest Student Transition Assistants took things a bit further over winter break. Prairie State College alumna, **Daj'za Mitchell**, chose to spend her time, along with a group of GSU students and faculty, traveling to Panama to provide workshops on human rights and assist lawyers to conduct legal clinics. This service learning project aimed to empower families, women and children in under resourced rural communities.

When asked about her inspiration to participate, Daj'za said, "Due to the fact that I live to serve others and consider my life a sacrifice of service, I wanted to go!" While she was eager to participate in the service learning experience, she also had some doubts regarding funding for the trip. Then, she learned about the GSU Global Learning Scholar grant. After receiving a call that she had been selected to receive this grant, she states "I was not only emotional but incredibly grateful and speechless! God answered my prayers and I was finally going to fulfill my dream of serving abroad. I am forever thankful to Dr. Phyllis West, Dr. Nicole Koonce and Amy Schoenberg for entrusting me with the responsibility and title of Global Learning Scholar."

After her experience in Panama, Daj'za says, "Panama is an amazing country full of amazing people! My experience there changed my life and I truly believe I came back a better, wiser, and more compassionate human being." She says that her biggest takeaway was the ability to recognize that the world is more alike than it is different; "I witnessed various commonalities in everything from the legal system, educational system and more." Daj'za's advice to others students is: "If you are considering participating in a service learning trip, DO IT!" She also would like to remind students of the scholarships and fundraisers available to help students participate in service learning. We applaud Daj'za and all of the GSU students that participated in this Legal Empowerment Brigade!
