## **DDP Transfer Checklist**

For those of you who are preparing to make your transfer to the university of your choice, here is a checklist designed to make sure that you have completed all the necessary steps to have your application for enrollment processed, take advantage of any scholarship opportunities, are on track with Financial Aid, and complete any other requirements to make sure you have a seamless transition to your final transfer destination. For assistance with any of the items below, please contact your DDP Transfer Specialist. They are ready to help you make a smooth transition towards your bachelor's degree!

- Applied/petitioned for graduation at your community college
- Applied to GSU, or your preferred university
- Ordered transcripts from each institution you have attended, to be sent to transfer institution. (Current semester courses allowed to be "In Progress"; you will be admitted conditionally so that you may move forward with financial aid, housing, and class registration in a timely fashion.) If transferring to GSU:
  - Electronically: apotranscripts@govst.edu
  - By mail: Governors State University, Admissions Processing, 1 University Parkway, University Park, IL 60484
- Added GSU or other preferred university's school code to your FAFSA for 2020-2021 (GSU's school code is 009145)
- Applied for student housing (if applicable) Be mindful of housing application and deposit deadlines!
- Received your program acceptance letter with new student login and email, student ID#, and Academic Advisor contact info
- Contacted new Academic Advisor for important information regarding your major and course scheduling
- Logged into your new student portal and registered for classes
- Received your new student materials (student ID, researched textbooks, etc.), and submitted your immunization form
- Once your associate degree has been conferred and posted, be sure to send one final, official transcript from your community college to your new transfer institution. (A final transcript is necessary to show that you have completed your associate degree, and to provide your final semester's grades.)

## Fall 2020 Transfers – AIM HIGH!

The <u>AIM HIGH scholarship</u> is an automatic, merit based award that is renewable at GSU for up to four semesters (not including summer.) In addition to the GPA and residency requirement, GSU must have your official transcript *with your associate degree posted* in order to apply the award to your student account. Contact your DDP Transfer Specialist, or the Office of Admissions, for more information!

## **Important Upcoming Dates**

## GSU Application Deadlines for Special Admissions Programs are Fast Approaching!

DDP students, if you are planning to transfer to GSU for the Fall 2020 semester, please be aware that some programs have application deadlines that are quickly approaching. Below is a list of undergraduate programs that have an application deadline in the upcoming summer months. Please contact your DDP Transfer Specialist for assistance in ensuring that you have all materials submitted before the deadline

- Health Administration: June 15
- Nursing (RN to BSN): July 1
- Community Health: Extended to August 15
- Social Work: August 7

## Thursday, July 9th – DDP Virtual Summer Induction

This particular Induction is for DDP students who are transferring to GSU in the summer or fall of 2020, and have not yet attended a past DDP Induction. Please check your email for an invitation, or contact your DDP Transfer Specialist for more information on how to RSVP!

## August 31st through Sept 4th – Welcome Week at GSU

DDP will be honoring those who recently graduated with an associate degree and transferred to GSU. There will be an opportunity to receive your first DDP cord, and participate in a variety of activities. There will also be a virtual Welcome Back Social for all DDP students to attend!

## September 14th through 18th - DDP Virtual Scholarship Symposium

We are taking this year's DDP Scholarship Symposium online! Look forward to a week's worth of resources that will aid students in finding ways to fund their DUAL degrees. Further details to be provided in the coming months.

## DDP Scholarship Deadline for Spring 2021 transfers is October 2, 2020

If you are planning to transfer to GSU in spring 2021, make sure to apply for the <u>GSU Promise Scholarship</u>, <u>DDP Honors Scholarship</u>, and/or the <u>DDP Chicago STAR Scholars Scholarships</u>. These scholarships are only available to DDP students. Students who qualify for both are encouraged to apply for both, although students may only be awarded one out of those eligible.

- The **GSU Promise Scholarship** is a competitive scholarship for DDP students who receive the Federal Pell Grant and have at least a 2.75 GPA. It covers full tuition and fees and a book stipend for up to four semesters at GSU (excluding summers). *Undocumented, Illinois residents are eligible for the GSU Promise \$600 book stipend; a residency affidavit must be completed in place of the FAFSA*.
- The **DDP Honors Scholarship** is a competitive scholarship for DDP students who are current members of their community college Honors Program or chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society and have at least a 3.5 GPA. It covers full tuition and fees at GSU for up to four semesters (excluding summers). *Undocumented, Illinois residents are eligible for the full DDP Honors Scholarship; a residency affidavit must be completed in place of the FAFSA*.
- DDP students at the City Colleges of Chicago may also be eligible for the DDP Chicago STAR Scholars Scholarship. It is open to DDP students who are enrolled in the Chicago STAR Scholars program, are active members of CCC's Honors Program or chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honors Society, and have a 3.25 GPA or above. There are two (2) scholarship categories. *Undocumented, Illinois residents are eligible for the full DDP Chicago STAR Scholars Scholarship; a residency affidavit must be completed in place of the FAFSA*.

Applications, recommendation forms, and FAQs can be found on the GSU Scholarship site.

All application materials are due by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 2, 2020!

These scholarships are only available to DDP students, so you have less competition than with other scholarships. 


