Financial Support

Financial Aid for students who are experiencing homelessness is available.

- The FAFSA contains three questions that ask about homelessness and this status must be verified.
- College Cost Reduction and Access Act of 2007 (CCRAA) expands the definition of "independent student" to include unaccompanied homeless youth. Specifically, the CCRAA states that youth who are 1) unaccompanied and homeless, or 2) unaccompanied, self-supporting and at-risk of homelessness at any time during the school year in which they sign the FAFSA, are considered independent.
- The Office of Financial Aid can work with students whose housing status has changed to reassess financial aid awards.

Food and Nutritional Support

The <u>Food Pantry</u>, located in A1115, is available Monday-Friday from 12:30 - 1:30 PM or at other times by contacting the Center for Student Engagement and Intercultural Programs in A2100.

<u>Illinois LINK Card for SNAP Benefits</u>: GSU4U partners with community organizations to host SNAP outreach events to assist students with LINK card applications. If students need assistance before the next on-campus event, current partner information is available on the GSU4U website.

Microwaves are available in the café and in the Jaguar Den (A2140). University Housing offers kitchen facilities on each floor for residential student use.

Housing Support

<u>University Housing</u> accepts housing applications and may offer a housing contract to students if space exists.

- Housing contracts are for 9 month or 12 month periods. There are no short term housing contracts. Students with 12 month contracts may stay year round, 9 month contracts may pay a per-night fee to stay during break periods (winter break & spring break). Summer contracts are also available.
- On-campus housing is only available for currently enrolled students. No family housing is available.
- Housing Guest & Visitation Policy: An overnight guest in Prairie Place may stay a maximum of 48 hours
 within a seven-day period. Exceptions may be granted by the Director of University Housing if special
 circumstances exist. Guests must be registered and escorted by their residential host at all times. The
 complete guest policy is available in the Housing Handbook.

Personal Care Support

<u>DEN Bags</u> (Distributing Emergency Necessities) – Students in need of toiletries or change of clothes can receive a free DEN Bag from the Jaguar Den.

The <u>Food Pantry</u>, located in A1115, is available Monday-Friday from 12:30 - 1:30 PM or at other times by contacting the Center for Student Engagement and Intercultural Programs in A2100. In addition to food, the Food Pantry also has personal care items (e.g., toothbrushes, razors, soap) and supplies for infant / toddler care (e.g., bottles, formula, diapers).

The <u>Recreation & Fitness Center</u> includes shower and locker facilities available for student use. The center is open seven days a week during the fall and spring semesters, and closed on Sundays during the summer session. Student lockers are available for \$5.00 per term. Lockers may be used to store books, other academic materials, and valuables. Students in need are eligible for a free locker rental and should contact Jaguar Den staff to register.

Academic & Career Support

The <u>Undergraduate Advising Center</u> offers academic advising to undergraduate students. For more information, contact the center by email at <u>advising@govst.edu</u>, phone 708.534.8043, or in person in C3385.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) is a federally funded grant program to assist unemployed individuals in entering or returning to the workforce. GSU has many of its programs approved for WIOA funding by the Will County Workforce Board. Although GSU does not provide vouchers, we honor them for our approved programs. Students may use financial aid to purchase books and course materials in the GSU Bookstore via FA Link prior to financial aid disbursement. The University Library can assist with locating course texts via the interlibrary loan system.

The <u>CUBE</u> and <u>Library</u> offer computers for student use and many common programs needed for classes. The library also maintains a supply of phone chargers for students to borrow while using the library.

Health, Wellness, & Emotional Support

The <u>Counseling and Wellness Center</u> provides free medical services and counseling services to enrolled students. Appointments may be scheduled online. <u>Aunt Martha's Health & Wellness</u> offers care coordination, healthcare services, child welfare, and community wellness resources. The location closest to GSU is in Olympia Fields, IL. To discuss care or schedule an appointment, call 708.747.7100.

Child and Dependent Care Support

<u>CCAMPIS</u> is a federal grant from the U.S. Department of Education to provide free or discounted childcare to ensure student parent enrollment, persistence, and graduation. The goal of CCAMPIS is to assist low-income, full-time GSU undergraduate students with child care expenses at the Family Development Center so that they persist and graduate. Applications are reviewed on a first come, first-served basis. Read more about eligibility and program requirements on the GSU4U website and apply online today!

<u>Financial Aid</u> For a student with dependents, an allowance for costs expected to be incurred for dependent care may be included in your cost of attendance. This covers care during periods that include, but are not limited to, class time, study time, field work, internships, and commuting time for the student. If approved, the amount of the allowance will be based on the number and age of your dependents and will not exceed reasonable costs in the community for the kind of care provided. To see if you qualify, complete a <u>Budget Adjustment Form</u> and submit it with additional documentation to your Financial Aid advisor.
